George Canyon rose to becoming one of Canada's hottest Country Music stars in the early 2000's and has won countless accolades and awards, including Juno Awards, CCMA Awards, and ECMA Awards to name a few. He has been inducted into the Nova Scotia Country Music Hall of Fame, recorded 12 albums, and was recently presented a certified Platinum Award for his debut album 'One Good Friend'. With country hits like Just Like You, I Believe in Angels, Drinkin' Thinkin', Daughters of the Sun, I Got This, I Want You To Live, Slow Dance and many more.


Canyon is so much more than an award-winning musical talent. Helping others has always been a huge priority for him, particularly for children with Diabetes and his work as spokesperson for the Juvenile Diabetes Research Foundation (JDRF). He was also recognized by the Canadian Country Music Association with the Humanitarian Award in recognition of his work with JDRF and the Canadian military.

Among his many identities, Canyon is also a proud Canadian and huge hockey fan, and roots for his team, the Calgary Flames, for which he just completed his 10th season singing the national anthem during the home games). With all that he does, one might think that Canyon doesn't often have time for anything else, but they would be so very wrong. When asked he will happily admit that being a husband and dad is still his number one job.

Canyon's love of painting started when he was young but he set the brushes aside for his music career until recently when he was on tour and picked up the brushes once again to reunite his love of art and discovered how much he loved and He is looking forward to the reveal of his art to everyone at the Pure West Auction

Rebecca Shuttleworth B. 1996 Ranching in a Hackmore

Rebecca Shuttleworth is an artist from Balzac, Alberta where she was raised on her family's farm. Her art career began from a young age when she sold her first painting at 13 years old. She received recognition when she received the 2014 Calgary Stampede Grade 12 Scholarship and was accepted into the Calgary Stampede's 2015 Live Auction. She was later featured in Southwest Art Magazine's 21 Under 31. Some of her most famous commissions have been for Douglas Lake Ranch and Heartland star Amber Marshall. Her prints have sold across North America, Mexico and Australia. Shuttleworth's highest honor to date was being the 2019 Calgary Stampede Poster Artist and she was the first youth to complete the poster.

Darcy Presiloski B. 1952 Bully For You 16x20" Oil on Linen

Darcy Presiloski spent her early childhood on a farm west of Granum. in southern Alberta. Living in Calgary and with Darcy's farm background it is not surprising that her primary focus is western art. She finds inspiration at brandings, cattle drives, rodeos and sometimes in a field at the side of the highway. The animals, the everyday activities and gear of the working cowboy all tell stories that she endeavors to express in her paintings. Presiloski loves to depict people and animals, but horses are her particular favorite. She works in oils, pastels, graphite and charcoal. For a number of years her pieces have been juried into the Calgary Stampede Western Showcase. Her work can be found in the Parks Canada collection and private collections in Canada, The United States and New Zealand.



Trish Purcell B. 1960 On A Winter's Day

Trish Purcell was born in Cork, Ireland and now lives in Calgary. Her sense of style and colour is obvious in her bold approach to her art. She works in oils. Primarily self-taught, Purcell continues to explore and expand her expression by seeking out artists to study with and learn from.

Dixie Edge was born and raised in the Crowsnest Pass where her passion for art was first inspired by her mother. Edge is a self-guided artist. Her western lifestyle of ranching west of Cochrane, as well as competitive reined cow horse and rodeo, contribute to intimately understanding of her diverse subject matter for her brush to entertain a canvas. Living close to Morley has given opportunity to understand, interact and appreciate the culture and traditions of Indigenous peoples. Edge tries to embrace the moment and instill the feeling "of being" there in her paintings and she believes in "paint what you know" theory. Edge's pieces can be found in numerous collections and have been awarded numerous Western heritage and People's Choice awards.

She says of Roper On The Waldron, "For many years it was rare to see a woman in the branding pen, roping. There were a few tough girl cowgirls out there, but not many were allowed into the roping circle. The young women of today have taken a hold of all the ranch tasks. This young cowgirl manages a portion of the Waldron Ranch.

Edward Borein was one of a handful of early Western artists who was actually born in the West. As a young man he roamed the western states and territories and much of Mexico, working as a cowboy and using his artistic talent to record these experiences.

Developing a deep affection for the West, and nurtured by his free lifestyle as a cowboy, he soon became known as a facile and spontaneous recorder of cowboy and Indian life.

In his early 30's Borein decided to pursue a career as a professional artist and moved to New York City, where his studio soon became a favorite haunt for important figures such as Will Rogers, Charles M. Russell, Carl Oscar Borg and Buffalo Bill Cody.

Borein returned to his native California, married, and set up a permanent studio in Santa Barbara in 1921. His etchings, watercolors, and drawings quickly earned him a reputation as one of the foremost interpreters of the American West, and few artists have done so as accurately and skillfully as Borein.

Note: The etchings in this lot are signed "in the plate" by Edward Borein. Two are restrikes, likely printed from his original etching plate after his death. His biographer, Harold Davidson estimated there were about 30 plates of Borein's that were printed after his death in 1945. "Out of the Gate" comes with a letter from Davidson stating the etching was printed in lifetime.

Allen Sapp B. 1928-2015 Stretching the Pelt 16x12" Acrylic Estimate \$1,500-\$2,500



Born on the Red Pheasant reserve in Saskatchewan, Allen Sapp, or Kiskayetum (He Perceives It), became known for his authentic records of the Cree people and their activities. Often bedridden with illness, Sapp was an infrequent school attendee and never learned to read or write. After his mother died, he was raised by his maternal grandmother, who encouraged his love of drawing and taught him the ways of the Cree people.

For the most part Sapp was a self-taught artist. He is said to have worked instinctively with a photographic memory; painting the pictures he saw in his mind. His paintings tell a personal story, but many appreciate them for their ability to go beyond that and represent a generation of Cree people and other prairie inhabitants of the same era.

In 1969, he was awarded a Canada Council Arts Bursary. He was inducted into the Royal Canadian Academy of Arts in 1987 in recognition of his achievements in the visual arts. In 1981, the book A Cree Life: The Art of Allen Sapp was released. Sapp was made an Officer of the Order of Canada, in recognition of both his work as a painter and the part he played in telling the story of the Cree nation. In 2003, he received the Governor General's Award for the illustrations he did for the children's book The Song Within My Heart, a story about a young Cree boy based on Sapp's memories.

The paintings of Sapp reveal what a reservation meant to those for whom it was home. Like Remington and Russell in the United States before him, Sapp was a historical chronicler of a life and society that has passed into history, recorded with the sensitivity of one who was part of it. Sapp's paintings masterfully depict First Nations culture, the simple elegance of rural life and the beauty of Saskatchewan. With honesty, without embellishment, and with a deep sense of mood, the artist depicted a bleak environment in a harsh climate.


Adeline Halvorson B. 1957 Catch A Breeze

Adeline Halvorson knew at an early age that she wanted to be an artist. In her rural upbringing, animals, especially horses, played a very important role. She spends most of her time researching and creating the paintings she markets to a growing group of collectors. Years of riding and grooming horses have given Halvorson a knowledge of anatomy and muscle movement that her painting skills bring to life on the canvas. The shapes and movement of muscle, variety and texture of harness and trappings, as well as the horse and its interaction with its human counterparts provide endless artistic inspiration for one who grew up with a love for one of the world's most beautiful animals.

Halvorson received the Outstanding Artistic Achievement award from the Calgary Stampede in 2014, as well as winning Best of Show in 2012,2009 and 1995. She was also the Calgary Stampede poster artist in 2013 and her original painting used in the poster sold at auction for \$125,000.

Halvorson had the high selling painting at the 2022 Charlie Russell First Strike Auction, with a hammer price of \$40,000.

Tracey Britton is a contemporary western artist, born and raised on a farm in Alberta surrounded by horses and cattle, but now living in a small hamlet in rural southern Saskatchewan, where she draws inspiration from the valley surrounding her there.

Her passion for art was apparent at a very young age, but moving and living in Holland for four years in her teens, allowed her to travel throughout parts of Europe immersing herself in the works of the masters and igniting her passion to become a professional artist. Upon returning to Canada she attended the Alberta College of art, got married and raised two children, all the while painting and creating when she could. She now has paintings in collections throughout Canada and the USA.

Her current works focus on the wild horses of Canada and the United States, raising awareness of the plight of these living icons of the West and the fight to keep them as they are – wild and free.

As it is for Doug Krause, Shannon's collaborator on this authentic, unique piece. Krause is a saddle maker, silversmith and mecate master, and when he reached out to Lawlor to do a collaboration piece, she was quick to embrace the notion of working outside the box with such a talent.

Lawlor has many accomplishments under her belt in the art world and her work has become highly collectible to those in the industries of the West in which she portrays. As of late, 2023 brought Shannon a notable runner up position in the Western Horseman Best of Artists Award, and has been nominated again for the award this year. She is a proud sponsor of the NCHA (National Cutting Horse Association) and NRCHA (National Reined Cow Horse Association) for the very values expressed in her ethos.

Neil Hamelin B. 1975 Haulin' Cash! 11x14" Oil Estimate \$1,500-\$1,750



Canadian artist Neil Hamelin draws his creative fuel from the weathered wood and peeling paint that serve as silent witnesses to our heritage. Through his oil paintings, he masterfully resurrects forgotten tales and adventures, weaving narratives of bygone eras through the people, homesteads, and landscapes long faded from memory.

Hamelin's artistic journey is a nostalgic voyage, as he delves into the past to ignite his imagination and pave a path for these stories into the future. Immersed in the western culture, Hamelin shares a unique bond with the horses, people, and rural lifestyle he portrays, infusing his work with sincerity and firsthand experiences.

While renowned for his captivating portraits, Hamelin's acclaim extends nationally, with his artwork gracing coins released by the Royal Canadian Mint. Among his notable subjects are multiple portraits of Queen Elizabeth II. His pieces adorn the walls of private collectors and corporate spaces worldwide, resonating with audiences who cherish the timeless allure of his craftsmanship.

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Scott Hardy, a fifth-generation stockman, understands the dedication required to excel. Though largely self-taught, Hardy acknowledges the influence of modern masters Al Pecetti and Mark Drain. A full-time silversmith and engraver since 1981, Hardy has been honoured by the Academy of Western Artists, receiving the 2001 Will Rogers Award as Engraver of the Year. In 1994 his entry was judged Best of Show at the Cowboy Poetry Gathering in Elko, Nevada. Hardy was commissioned by the Calgary Stampede to create 100 hand-engraved silver and gold buckles commemorating the Stampede's 2012 Centennial. Canada Post issued a stamp featuring Hardy's buckle to celebrate the Stampede's centennial making Hardy the first silversmith with work featured on a Canadian stamp.

"Embellishing horse and rider with precious metals is a tradition as old as man on horseback. Crossing tribal and cultural boundaries, silver and gold trappings have expressed the pride of horsemen throughout the millennia. The image of the cowboy still stirs our ideals of independence, integrity and freedom, while appreciation of things well-made, by hand, flourishes in this age of mass production and mediocrity." ~ Scott Hardy

Hardy is one of two Canadian founding members of the Traditional Cowboy Arts Association, a group which represents the elite artists in the four disciplines of the cowboy arts: silversmithing, rawhide braiding, saddle making and bit and spur making. He currently serves as President of the TCAA.

Michael Sydoryk B. 1991

Pressure 48x48" Acrylic Estimate \$5,200-\$6,000



Michael Sydoryk is a self-taught artist from Cochrane, Alberta with a honed focus on wildlife work, painting larger-than-life pieces that are vividly illustrative, and feature a contemporary experience through the great, bold brush strokes he employs.

His style can capture a range of the subject matter from motion, to serenity, capturing the emotional feel of whatever animal he has chosen to paint. His inspiration is wildlife and he elevates each piece with color, contrast and engaging compositions.

Sydoryk has been an artist at the Calgary Stampede Western Showcase since the start of his art career in 2017. He is represented by Avens Gallery in Canmore, Alberta and the Dick Idol Gallery in Whitefish, Montana.

Shannon Luyendyk is a native Albertan who resides in Cochrane, finding inspiration through her love of horses and western heritage. Luyendyk's art work has also been juried and selected into the Calgary Stampede Western Showcase, as well as the CM Russell Art Auction several years.

Her chuckwagon piece of the late Richard Cosgrave is in BP Amoco's corporate collection and was used to commemorate Amoco's 50th Anniversary. Luyendyk has won numerous awards in her local Cochrane Art Club which include the Western Heritage Award and People's Choice award.

Jody Skinner is a self-taught artist who works exclusively with oils on linen, applying the oils with palette knives to provide rich texture to her canvas. Raised on a ranch in the foothills of the Rocky Mountains, Skinner's love of horses resonates in her pieces. Each piece she has painted depicts modern horse life, ranging from rodeo to the wild horses of Canada and the United States.

In 2009, Skinner was the Calgary Stampede Poster Artist, featuring the famous bucking horse Grated Coconut. She has received numerous awards over the years and her work is featured in prominent corporate, hotel and private collections across North America.

In 1983, in his 5th year at the Alberta College of Art, Paul Van Ginkel accepted a job at the Calgary Herald newspaper as an editorial illustrator. He later resigned in 1990 to pursue his dream of being a full time fine art painter.

Despite painting many different subjects, Van Ginkel specializes in western themes, and has created close to 2,300 pieces so far with his oil paintings placed in private and corporate collections around the world. The Calgary Stampede has been instrumental in shaping his career. His first year in the art auction was 1986 and this will be his 21st show in the Western Showcase (his first was in 1991). In 2006 he was the first "fine artist" chosen to paint the annual Calgary Stampede poster while last year the Stampede commissioned a painting to help celebrate 100 years of chuckwagon racing. "History in the Dust" was reproduced on a 28 x 16 foot mural on Stampede Park and is also available in print.

Van Ginkel has received many awards and distinctions, has had numerous newspaper and magazine cover feature articles including in the July/August 2023 issue of Art of the West magazine. He has also been featured in videos and documentaries such as Amazon Prime, Cowboy Country and a new 35 minute film that was just released. Van Ginkel's definition of success in the arts is not being "rich and famous", it's being able to be a painter his entire life. He represents himself, is always open to custom (commission) paintings and has chosen to have only one U.S. based gallery in Colorado.

Judd Thompson B. 1983 Winter's Pass 32x38" Mixed Media Estimate \$2,000-\$4,000

Judd Thompson is a contemporary western artist. Born in 1983, Thompson spent his formative years growing up on the Crow Indian Reservation, gaining inspiration from the art he was surrounded by in his parents' business,The Custer Battlefield Trading Post. Thompson draws inspiration from Western artists. He uses his passion for color theory to capture the essence of Crow Country in a variety of media.

After graduating from the University of Wyoming in 2010 with a degree in Art and Art History, Thompson moved to Billings, Montana, where he currently resides. He is best known for his painting, Horse Called Paint, that was featured as a Pendleton blanket, and recently added to their permanent Artist collection. Thompson has worked with interior design companies such as Old Hickory Furniture and Kibler & Kirch. He has been featured in numerous publications such as Mountain Living Magazine, Big Sky Journal and Cowgirl Magazine.

Andrew Kiss, an artist with over 55 years of experience, paints stunning landscapes inspired by his Canadian upbringing. His artwork has won numerous awards and has allowed him to exhibit and travel the world. Using vibrant colors and meticulous brushstrokes, he creates scenes of nature that evoke feelings of peace and joy. From majestic mountains to serene lakes, his paintings showcase the beauty of our world, reminding us to cherish it every day. Through his dedication and talent, he has built a legacy that celebrates the splendor of nature and inspires others to see the world through an artist's eyes.

Kendel Kinahan B. 1988 Ropin' Renegades 24x48" Oil

Growing up in a small farming community in Northern Alberta, Kinahan has always found a strong connection with the land. She finds inspiration in the colours and textures that nature provides. Her pieces have primarily been created using acrylic or charcoal, however she has recently discovered the expansive world of painting with oils. Over the years Kinahan has moved around Alberta, gathering bits and pieces of inspiration along the way, however, it wasn't until she moved to the foothills and immersed herself in western culture, that she truly felt at home in her style.

Looking at the evolution of her work you'll see her progression artistically in technique and theme. Through it all, you'll see her true love of the West that Kinahan shares with her collectors –visible in the softness of everybrushstroke.

Neepin Auger B. 1988 Calling Me Home 36x36" Acrylic on Canvas Estimate \$3,600-\$4,000




Neepin Auger is a Cree artist, educator and mother. Originally from the Bigstone Cree Nation in northern Alberta, she has been painting for over 10 years, having studied art under her father, Dale Auger, a renowned First Nations artist and author

Utilizing a dramatic and dynamic colour palette, Auger's energetic pieces are a magnificent representation of elevated simplicity, impactful design and the timelessness of culture and family. Employing a minimalistic dialogue, the artist's strong use of line and form lend definition to works that present plentiful tableaus bursting with soulfulness.

Auger's lively works are visual song pieces; melodies in paint that both soothe and delight the senses, bringing to life fables, legends, and tradition. The artist's work is truly timeless and like the subject matter depicted, remains steeped in magic.

Gaile Gallup B. 1949 Mule Deer 16x12" Oil Estimate \$1,500-\$2,000



Gaile Gallup lives in the ranching county of Longview, Alberta with his wife Kerri. He retired from ranching in 2005 to concentrate on his art fulltime.

Gallup was commissioned to paint the 2015 Ponoka Stampede poster. He has been juried into the Calgary Stampede Art Auction and the C.M. Russell Exhibition and Sale in Great Falls, Montana. His oil painting "Saddling Fresh Horses" was the high selling contemporary piece at the 2012 Calgary Stampede Art Auction, with a hammer price of \$20,000. He still rides throughout the year and has said, "If you can't get inspired in this country, you never will."

Leah Lucas B. 1952 Earth Keepers 9x12" Oil

Leah Lucas was raised in southern Alberta. From early childhood, she reveled in the freedom to explore her world on horseback. She would forever be informed by miles of flat unending 360-degree views, covered with expansive blue skies, butted against the imposing Rockies in the distance.

Developing a deep connection with the natural world, fostered by a profound love and understanding of horses, led to her life's passion. Says Lucas, "What I value from my connection to the landscape and to horses freedom, communion, persistence, relying always on the feel of truth, rather than on truth as espoused by others - I bring to my painting, I search always for uncompromising teachers and methods to achieve the best."

Trained in the representational style, Lucas seeks images to awaken a resonance within, which she aims to translate onto canvas. She reveals, "I never know in advance what will speak to me; therefore, I openly attend to everything, awaiting the inner call that leads to action. Always, there are surprises. As an artist, I aspire to present what may be comfortably familiar in unique and sometimes startling ways."

Karen Coe B. 1979 Pondering 20x30" Acrylic and Epoxy

Art is a deeply rooted passion for Karen Coe, one that she has continued to foster and grow throughout her years of painting. As a young girl, Coe's creative fire was ignited by her neighbor, James Watling, the noted children's book illustrator and McGill University Professor. She spent time learning from Watling, then continued on to study art at the University of Lethbridge, graduating with a Bachelor of Fine Arts.

Coe grew up on the back of a horse and that has not changed to this day. She incorporates her love for horses, wildlife and the outdoors into each of her paintings. She shares her life with her husband, their four beautiful children, her dogs and Quarter Horse, all of whom she is thankful for.

Janice Tanton B. 1961 Patterns

40x60" Oil on Belgian Linen Estimate \$7,100-\$7,500



An award-winning painter and Alumna of Distinction from Durham College, Janice Tanton also studied at the University of Windsor BFA (Acting) and serves as the first-ever Teaching Artist in Residence (Banff Centre).

Moving from Ontario with her family to Treaty 7 Territory in 2005, she served as Program Manager for Indigenous Leadership at the Banff Centre. She discovered artistic inspiration and support through close relationships with faculty and participants from indigenous communities from across Canada and Australia. She is honoured to have been ceremonially adopted as the daughter of Elder Tom Crane Bear of Siksika, initiated into the pow wow dance circle and is a tipi holder. Seeking to reconcile the wide spectrum of diversity within her communities and families, Janice's art focusses on cross-cultural relationships through painting, film and performance arts. They are just a glorious animal."

Artist's note on bronze: "La Primera, or The First" has multiple layers of inspiration. Engraved on the scroll that serves as a base is an inscription that I discovered years ago in a Robert Vavra book. It was a Bedouin legend that said, "And God took a handful of southerly wind, blew his breath over it and created the horse." A number of years ago local legendary, songwriter and performer Ian Tyson wrote a song by the same title, La Primera, about the first Spanish horses to come to the new world. They were descended from ancient Arabian lines. My sculpture depicts the hands of God releasing the first Arabian horse onto the earth.






Margaret Rocle grew up on the east coast and was trained at Philadelphia's Pennsylvania Academy of Fine Art and then the Art Students' League in New York. She met her husband in Paris while nursing during World War I and they eventually settled in California where they purchased a ranch. By the mid-1920s, Rocle returned to making art and was active in the San Diego scene. She was a member of the Society of Independent Artists, The San Francisco Society of Women Painters, and the San Diego Art Guild. She worked as a painter and a lithographer. She had an active exhibition record until the 1940s often winning prizes for her work and being shown at international expositions in Chicago, and San Diego. She and her husband went on to raise Arabian horses into the 1960s. After her death, the family were unable to find any of her art in the estate. (See Kamerling's essay on her in The Journal of San Diego History, 40:3, 1994.)
